REPORT TO THE SECOND COUNCIL OF GOVERNORS MEETING TO BE HELD ON 2 MAY 2024

Dear CC Bernd and fellow Council Members.

Firstly, I would like to thank my cabinet members for their hard work in making the 9 months of this fiscal year one of great achievement and lots of success in the various challenges we have faced as a District.

ADMINISTRATION

We are currently 57 clubs in our District. 100% of clubs are reporting their membership MMRs on MyLCI. 97% of clubs are reporting their activities on MyLion. Assistance has been offered by our GST with a wonderful improvement with only 1 club not reporting. Well, done to DC Linda for her hard work. The district funding is in good standing and continues to ensure that the finances are monitored and maintained in a good working standard. Guiding Lions have been put in place for those clubs that need assistance.

2022 and beyond

To strengthen the membership in the district is one of the major goals of 2022 and beyond. All the 2022 and Beyond goals are incorporated into the District Governors goals. These goals are addressed in the various portfolios and categories and will be part of the portfolio planning. The GAT team and region chairpersons meet every month to discuss our set plan. Two training sessions for beyond 2024-2027 was done. One in Namibia at their indaba and one in Paarl. Thanks for PCC Cliff who travel to Namibia and Paarl to do this training secessions.

MEMBERSHIP

The membership stats as of January 2024 is 877 now currently we on 882— with a gain /loss -21. When inducting new members. Retention (2VDG Bevil Lakay)

A Retention committee with the aim to support our clubs in crating a culture of retaining our membership. 68% OF OUR CLUBS HAVE LESS THAN 20 MEMBERS

As per District Governors goal we agree to charter two new clubs in this fiscal year.

- GOAL is to charter two new clubs during fiscal year 2023-2024.
- To introduce Club branch concept as a way of increasing club membership and future new clubs
- 72% of our clubs have less than 20 members. The GAT strategy for the next three years has been table at the cabinet meeting. We need to charter at least 1 club and we need to induct at least 76 members to qualify for reimbursement. Encourage clubs to see the value of club Branches and to identify opportunity areas.

GMA

The GMA has been a key focus and. The GET will looking at various areas where clubs can be formed and will be looking at Information evenings to see the interest. The focus will be also on the clubs with lesser than 15 members to assist and increase their membership.

LEADERSHIP (GLT PDG Tillie Nel)

Club training requirements poll was done do they need more practical training session on their portfolios. This gives us a clear indication what needs to be done for the incoming officer training. All training will be done at the end of June. A positive aspect for lions' leadership journey been experience positive and good future leaders has been identified. We need to re-visit our plan and make sure that regularly follow up with clubs.

To date 417 participants attended local training offered by the district.
